The University of Notre Dame is pleased to announce **GLOBES**, a new interdisciplinary PhD program studying **Global Linkages of Biology, Environment, and Society**. Launched by funding from an IGERT (Integrated Graduate Education, Research and Traineeship) grant from the National Science Foundation, **GLOBES** seeks to educate future scholars, scientists and leaders with the biological, social, economic, legal and ethical training they will need to combat pressing world environmental problems in human and global health.

GLOBES Fellowship Training

- A team-based approach brings together faculty and student scholars from across the University of Notre Dame's College of Science, College of Arts and Letters and Law School to collaborate on research and policy solutions to real-world challenges.
- Cross-disciplinary courses, seminars and training modules on campus and in Washington, D.C. help students hone research, teaching, communication, policy, and leadership skills.
- Field research projects involve interdisciplinary teams of students and faculty researching human and environmental health at sites in North America, China, West Africa, Bali and Haiti.
- Student-led seminars and symposia provide more opportunities to explore seminal **GLOBES** topics with renowned experts and scholars.

GLOBES Stipends

Fellowships, available to U.S. residents and permanent citizens, include generous yearly stipends, a full waiver of graduate tuition, research and travel funds. International students can participate in **GLOBES** with financial assistance from home departments.

Application Procedures

GLOBES graduate students enroll in a home department in which they pursue their PhD degrees. Participating Notre Dame departments include Biological Sciences, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biochemistry, Economics and Econometrics, History, Philosophy, History and Philosophy of Science, and Theology. The Department of Anthropology is also an active participant but does not have a Ph.D. program. Anthropology students can enroll in the Department of Biological Sciences and be co-advised by faculty from both Biology and Anthropology.
